We at Retiree Chapter 82 would like to invite you to join our organization.

We have a membership of over 2,200 members in six Sub Chapters; five of them are in New York State, one in Florida and another for those living elsewhere across the United States. I hope that the following will answer some questions regarding our Organization.

- 1) Purpose of the Organization to:
 - a. Maintain the integrity of the Retirement System and
 - b. Insure that the State Comptroller adheres to the State Constitution.
- 2) The chief purpose of our Organization is to maintain and improve retiree benefits.
- 3) The benefits of belonging to this Organization are to have a collective voice on Federal and State Issues that affect retirees.
- 4) Initiatives taken by the Organization are to maintain direct contact with civil service, health benefits, retirement systems and the New York State Comptroller Office.
- 5) Officers and our Board Members are not salaried or compensated other than by receipted expenses. We own no buildings or have any other capital assets. Our only source of income is \$2.00 per month per member, of which \$3.00 per year is returned to the sub-chapter for their use on the local level, as well as, \$.50 per month affiliation fee to the International level. This equates to \$7.50 per month which includes the \$5.50 premium for the \$3,000 Death Benefit.

I hope that the above information is helpful in making your decision with regard to joining with us to collectively insure we maintain all of our benefits.
